

CITY OF GARIBALDI, OREGON

ORDINANCE NUMBER 332

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE CITY TO BILL FOR CERTAIN FIRE AND EMERGENCY SERVICES AND ESTABLISHING EXCEPTIONS

WHEREAS, the City of Garibaldi (“City”) and the Garibaldi Fire District (“District”) have entered into an Intergovernmental Agreement which authorizes the City of Garibaldi to provide fire and emergency services to the District and allows the City to serve as the primary responder within both City and District boundaries; and

WHEREAS, the City’s fire and emergency service personnel regularly respond to emergency incidents occurring both inside and outside City and District boundaries, including on Transportation Routes and in Unprotected Areas, and such responses sometimes serve persons who are not taxpaying patrons or residents of either the City or the District; and

WHEREAS, both the City and the District desire to recover from non-residents or non-taxpayers the actual costs of providing certain emergency and fire response services, including responses on Transportation Routes within the City or District, responses outside City or District boundaries, or responses in Unprotected Areas outside City or District boundaries; and

WHEREAS, the City and the District also desire to recover the actual cost of providing other fire and emergency response services which place an undue burden on City and District resources, such as the cost of responding to repeated False Alarms; and

WHEREAS, such responses require costly equipment and personnel and some of the persons served by such responses have not shared in the costs; and

WHEREAS, ORS 221.410 authorizes a city to take all action necessary or convenient for the government of its local affairs, which includes: 1) charging fees for the billing of certain fire and emergency response services to persons who do not reside within City limits or pay City taxes; and 2) charging fees for fire and emergency response services which place an undue burden on the City’s Fire Department; and

WHEREAS, ORS 478.410(4) authorizes a fire district to adopt an ordinance authorizing the collection of cost-based fees for any services provided by the District; and

WHEREAS, ORS 478.310 authorizes a fire district to recover its reasonable and actual expenses for responses on Transportation Routes inside the district and responses in Unprotected Areas outside its boundaries; and

WHEREAS, the Garibaldi City Council and the Fire District Board of Directors have each examined the current Oregon State Fire Marshal’s Standardized Cost Schedule from the Oregon Fire Service Mobilization Plan and have determined that such costs would reasonably

and satisfactorily reimburse the Fire Department and the Fire District for their respective, actual costs incurred in responding; and

WHEREAS, the Garibaldi City Council and the Garibaldi Fire District Board of Directors have each examined the fees proposed to be charged under this Ordinance and have determined that they accurately reflect the actual costs of providing the services; and

WHEREAS, the Garibaldi City Council and the Garibaldi Fire District Board of Directors have each independently determined that it is fair, reasonable, and appropriate to adopt this cost recovery mechanism to collect the actual costs of providing such services to non-residents or non-taxpayers as long as such fees are limited to cost recovery only and will not be used to generate revenue; and

WHEREAS, the City and the Fire District may choose to delegate the assessment and collection of such fees to a responsible and experienced third party, as long as the collection and use of such fees comply with this Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, the fees and charges authorized by this Ordinance are not taxes subject to property tax limitations of Article XI, Section 11(b) of the Oregon Constitution;

WHEREAS, members of the public were allowed to comment on the fees at a City Council meeting held on April 19, 2021;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED AS FOLLOWS:

1. **ADOPTION AND AMENDMENT OF RATE SCHEDULE.** The Garibaldi City Council hereby adopts the rates set forth in the Rate and Fee Schedule (which includes the current Oregon State Fire Marshal's Standardized Cost Schedule as it is now drafted or as it may be amended by the Oregon State Fire Marshal in the future), both of which are attached to this Ordinance as Appendix A and by this reference incorporated herein.
 - 1.1 The City Council hereby directs that such rates and fees shall be charged and calculated to recover no more than a reasonable estimate of the actual cost of providing services.
 - 1.2 The Garibaldi City Council may amend the Rate and Fee Schedule by Resolution.

2. **FEES ESTABLISHED.** The Garibaldi City Council hereby establishes and adopts the following cost-based fees, which may be imposed subject to the Fire Chief or their designee's sole discretion in compliance with this Ordinance and any applicable City administrative rules or procedures.
 - 2.1 False Fire and Medical Alarm Fee.

2.1.1 Authorization. The Fire Department may impose a cost-based fee for responses to false fire and medical alarms, subject to this Ordinance and to the below exceptions. Cancelled enroute responses are billable events subject to this Ordinance. Fees under this section will be based upon the rates in Appendix A, as well as other documented actual costs of responding.

2.1.2 Exceptions.

- a. No cost recovery fee shall be imposed for the first two (2) responses to false alarms to a residential or commercial occupancy during a calendar year.
- b. No cost recovery fee shall be charged if the fire alarm is a result of a fire or results in medical treatment being provided by EMS personnel. Cancelled enroute, false alarms and medical alarms are billable events subject to this Ordinance. Fees under this section will be based upon the rates in Appendix A, as well as other documented actual costs of responding.

3. OPEN BURNING VIOLATIONS FEE. A cost-based fee may be imposed for responses to incidents involving open/negligent burning violations. Open/negligent burning violations are defined as violations of any locally adopted fire code or violations of any applicable Oregon Revised Statute or DEQ regulation pertaining to illegal or open burning. Such fees may be imposed for repeated violations, egregious or purposeful violations, or for any open/negligent burning violation during high and extreme fire danger. Fees will be based upon the rates in Appendix A, as well as other documented actual costs of responding to the violation.

4. TRANSPORTATION ROUTE RESPONSE FEE. A cost-based fee may be imposed for responses on Transportation Routes, as further provided in this section. "Transportation Route" means any roadway, railway, right-of-way, or waterway, against which no taxes or assessments for fire protection are levied by the City of Garibaldi. Cost-based fees may be imposed for any responses to any incidents, responses, or occurrences on such Transportation Routes, including but not limited to aircraft or train crashes.

4.1 Calculation of Fee: Transportation Route response invoices will use dispatch time records to determine the commitment of apparatus and personnel and will use the rates as listed in Appendix A, as well as other documented actual costs of responding to the violation. Miscellaneous supplies and service may also be invoiced and will be based upon scene documents of the officer in charge.

4.2 Exception: Transportation Route Response Fees shall not be billed or charged to City residents or City taxpayers.

5. UNPROTECTED OR INADEQUATELY PROTECTED AREA RESPONSE FEE. A cost-based fee may be imposed for responses to incidents in Unprotected Areas or inadequately protected areas outside of the Fire Department boundaries as provided in this section. Fees will be based upon the rates in Appendix A, as well as other documented actual costs of responding to the violation. Miscellaneous supplies and services may also be invoiced and will be based upon the rates provided in Appendix A as well as scene documentation of the officer in charge.
 - 5.1 Exception: Unprotected or Inadequately Protected Area Fees shall not be billed or charged to City residents or City taxpayers.
6. NON-EMERGENCY FACILITY RESPONSE FEE. A cost-based fee may be imposed for certain non-emergency requests for assistance from assisted living, residential care, or nursing facilities as provided in this section. If Fire Department staff or resources are requested by a commercial assisted living, residential care, or nursing facility (collectively “care facilities”) to provide assistance to the staff for non-emergent situations, such as physically moving a non-injured resident, the City may impose the fees provided in this section upon the care facility. In determining whether to impose such fees the Fire Chief shall, in their sole discretion, consider whether the response was: 1) a result of a non-emergent situation; 2) due to a lack of adequate facility staffing or lack of adequate facility resources necessary to meet the resident’s needs, or 3) requested by a facility who has repeatedly requested non-emergency assistance. Such fees will be based on the Rates and Fee Schedule in Appendix A, as well as other documented actual costs of such response.
7. FIRE CODE INSPECTION AND ENFORCEMENT FEES. A cost-based fee for code inspections and code enforcement may be imposed for any fire and life safety occupancy inspections; for re-inspections for previously identified fire code violations; or for the costs of enforcing the fire code to correct previously identified violations as provided in this section. Fees assessed may include but are not limited to any incurred costs to obtain necessary inspection warrants, including attorney costs. Such fees will be based on the actual cost of conducting such inspections, enforcing the code, or performing any related work and shall be calculated using the applicable rates provided in Appendix A. Requests from contractors or business owners for new construction or maintenance inspections outside normal working hours may result in higher recovery cost fees due to the Fire Department’s increased personnel costs for such requests.
8. FACILITY RENTAL AND TRAINING CLASSES. A cost-based fee may be imposed for facility rentals or training classes. Such fee will be imposed at the discretion of the Fire Chief or his designee.
9. HAZARDOUS MATERIAL RESPONSE FEES. Cost based fees may be imposed for responses involving hazardous materials remediation and for hazardous materials-related incidents. Such fees may be imposed regardless of a state Hazardous Materials Team response and, if imposed, will only be charged for the hazardous materials-related costs.

Such fees will be based on the rates and fee schedule in Appendix A, as well as other documented actual costs of such response.

10. **UTILITY ASSISTANCE FEES.** Cost-based fees may be imposed for responses to utility calls for service and or emergencies. The Fire Department responds to utility service calls, such as electric cable wires down, water main leaks, etc. Cost based fees may be imposed upon the utility for such responses. Such fees will be based on the rates and fee schedule in Appendix A, as well as other documented actual costs of such response.
11. **TECHNICAL RESCUE FEES.** Cost-based fees may be imposed for responses requiring technical or specialty rescue such as low angle, high angle rope rescue, and swift water rescues. If such fees are imposed, they will only be charged for the costs related to technical or specialty rescue response. Such fees will be based on the rates and fee schedule in Appendix A, as well as other documented actual costs of such response.
12. **INVOICES; WAIVER.** The designated City staff shall address the invoices for fees to the responsible party or agent; which may include an occupant, a driver or passenger agent; a vehicle or plane owner or agent; an insurance company; or any person or entity requesting or receiving services or responsible for the property or response. For fire and emergency service fees, the Fire Chief, or their designee, shall be responsible for determining the responsible party and reviewing all cost recovery invoices. The Fire Chief may, at their sole discretion, waive or decrease the fees assessed in compliance with this Ordinance and any applicable administrative rules.
13. **REVIEW AND AMENDMENT.** The City Administrator, working in cooperation with the Fire Chief will present the fees or rates adopted under this Ordinance to the City Council for review and possible amendment at least every two years. The fees and Appendix A may be amended from time to time by Resolution at a duly noticed and public Council meeting.
14. **RULES.** The Council hereby grants to the City Administrator (for non-fire or emergency response fees, the Fire Chief (for fire or emergency response fees) or their designee the discretion to interpret and apply this Ordinance and to develop administrative rules to apply the Ordinance equitably and fairly. Such administrative rules must be written and must be consistent with this Ordinance and any applicable City laws, rules, and policies.
15. **APPEALS.** To file an appeal of a fee assessed under this Ordinance, the applicant must provide a written statement to the City Administrator within ten days of receipt of the fee invoice. The City Administrator shall consult with the Fire Chief if the appeal pertains to fire or emergency services, shall review the appeal, shall and respond in writing within ten working days. The City's response shall be the final response. The City Administrator shall inform the Council by providing the response and a report to the Council at the next City Council Meeting.
16. **COLLECTION PROCEDURES.** Payment for invoices billed under this Ordinance are due upon receipt. If payment or reasonable payment arrangements are not made within


(60) days of the billing, the invoice shall be considered delinquent and the City, or any designated third party, may proceed with the collections as deemed appropriate and necessary. Collection costs may be charged to the invoice and may include late charges or interest payments, subject to applicable law.

RATE AND FEE SCHEDULE AND ADMINISTRATIVE RULES
APPENDIX A**

The City adopts the current rates and fee schedule established by the Office of State Fire Marshal (OSFM) (OAR 837, division 130 and the State Fire Marshal's Oregon Fire Service Mobilization Plan and any applicable Conflagration Act), as it is now drafted or as it may be amended in the future. This OSFM cost and fee schedule will be used, when applicable, to set the billing rates regarding billing of actual costs associated with Fire Department resource usage and may include equipment rates.

Assisted Living, Residential Care, and Nursing Facilities: Responses that are involved will be billed on a per hour basis using the rates and fee schedule established by this Appendix A. In addition, actual administrative costs and overhead may be added to each invoice.

Public Records Request: Fees for service shall be limited to cost recovery. Methods of calculating the cost of services shall be identified and generally based upon the average cost of providing the time, materials of requested services, and overhead expenses (TMO). The City will calculate fees for service for specific requests when a request is estimated to require more than one quarter hour of staff time to accomplish. Cost calculations may include direct costs (transportation, personnel, and any miscellaneous supplies and services) and indirect costs (administrative overhead and facility costs).

General requests estimated at less than one-quarter of an hour to complete (includes labor):

Additional costs may be charged and may include (without additional markup):

- Archiving retrieval/restoring fees for off-site storage.
- Contracted employee costs of hiring temporary staff.
- If necessary, notary fees.
- Disposable supplies calculated upon specific usage and cost of replacement
- Legal Review for redactions.
- Other actual costs associated with the request of TMO.

Facility Rental and Training Class Fees: Each request for facility rental or class attendance will require an analysis of costs related to the request pertaining to class development, instruction, disposables, and other related costs. Class costs may include depreciation of props as a portion of the fee. If outside agencies request instructor(s), fees if applicable, will be based upon a signed contract for service.

Acquired Structure Live Fire Event: Each request for assistance from the Fire Department to demolish an existing home by fire will be evaluated on an individual basis. The Fire Department will charge the property owner the following for acquired structure live fire events. \$1,000.00 flat fee for homes/structures regardless of size. Property owner must provide current deed or title

to indicate the proper home and owner. Homeowner must also sign a waiver of release of liability.

- b) Procedures for completing the billing packet will be included with the billing packet.

4. Allowable Reimbursements

- a) Mobilized resources- Apparatus and personnel reimbursements begin when the resources leave their county staging area.
 - Career Firefighters-The state shall reimburse for the compensation paid to employees for the time such aid prevents them from performing their duties in the political subdivision by which they are employed.
 - Volunteers-The state will reimburse volunteers at a rate based upon the position they are filling during the conflagration for the actual number of hours they are in service on a mobilization up to 40 hours. After 40 hours on a mobilization, reimbursement will be paid at time and a half.

In the spring of 2021 and 2023 there will be an adjustment in reimbursement rates for all volunteer positions based on the December 31st year-to-year change of CPI-U West Region on a min/max schedule with a minimum reimbursement rate increase of 1% and a maximum reimbursement increase of 3% for each odd year Mob Plan Update. In 2024, a group of fire chiefs will convene to review average reimbursement rates and make recommendations to the Mob Plan Committee.

- Recalled Off-Duty Personnel -Reimbursement for recalled off-duty firefighters and substitute firefighters may be reimbursed.
- Replacement Personnel- In the event that a department wants to swap personnel, the state will reimburse only one individual per position at any given time. That is, OSFM will reimburse only the cost for the mobilized firefighters' mobilization travel, one firefighter's assigned time at the incident, and the

11. Equipment Rates

These rates are for equipment in good mechanical condition complete with all required attachments. Each rate includes costs for ownership and operation of equipment, including depreciation, overhead, all maintenance, fuel to and from the incident, lubricants, tires, OSHA equipment and other costs incidental to operation. Fuel will be provided while at the incident.
