

APPLICATION FOR RIGHT OF WAY PERMIT

Pursuant to Public Rights-of-Way Ordinance No. 174, enacted April 14, 1997, the City of Garibaldi has jurisdiction and exercises regulatory control over each public right-of-way (ROW). No person may occupy or encroach on a public right-of-way without the permission of the City. The City grants permission to use rights-of-way by franchises, licenses and permits set by Council resolution. The permit fee for the use of a public right of way is \$160 set by Resolution 2008-09.

A Right-of-Way Permit allows for a temporary encroachment on the City's right-of-way for dates approved by the Public Works Director. Permits shall be non-assignable and non-transferable and shall be surrendered immediately to the Public Works Director or City Administrator upon the cessation, sale or transfer of the use at this location.

The Public Works Director may, upon review of this application, ask for and the applicant must submit prior to issuance of a permit, additional documentation of the use or specifications for allowing such use.
